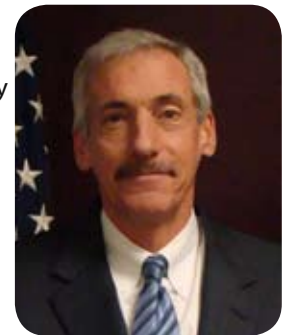

MESSAGE FROM THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR Robyn Barineau

The Department of Business and Professional Regulation and your Board of Cosmetology are very concerned about unlicensed activity in the cosmetology industry. In an effort to combat unlicensed activity, the Department established a toll-free telephone number to contact if you are aware of any unlicensed activity taking place in your area. That toll-free telephone number is 1.866.532.1440, or you may download a Uniform Complaint Form located at www.MyFloridaLicense.com and mail it to the Department once it has been completed. It is incumbent upon you to police your area and report unlicensed activity to the Department. You have worked hard to obtain and maintain your license and others should be held to the same standards.

On another note, the Board has completed some amendments that include:

- By July 1, 2008, a Board-approved consumer protection notice must be posted at all footbaths located in salons. The notice includes important information relating to sanitation requirements for the salon including pedicure chair units, license posting information, and unlicensed activity information. It can be downloaded from the Board's Web site at www.MyFloridaLicense.com > Direct to our Divisions > Cosmetology > Consumer Protection Notice regarding footbaths, sanitation and safety. If you are unable to download the notice, you may contact the Department's Customer Contact Center at 850.487.1395, and they will mail you a copy.
- Salon applicants are no longer required to submit proof of building and fire code compliance as a part of their application process. When signing the application for licensure, you must affirm that you are in compliance with all building and fire codes.

The actual rules text is noted later in this newsletter.

Finally, should your schedule permit, please try to join us for a Board meeting. The Board welcomes your attendance and participation at all meetings. I am certain you will be enlightened by the work of your Board. Rule Updates

Recently amended rules are listed below. The underlined portion represents new additions. Complete text of all rules can be viewed on the Board's Web page at www.MyFloridaLicense.com > Direct to Our Divisions > Cosmetology.

61G5-20.004 Display of Documents

(1) through (2) No change.

(3) By July 1, 2008, all holders of a cosmetology or specialty salon license shall display at each footbath a copy of the Consumer Protection Notice regarding footbaths, sanitation, and safety. Copies of this notice (revised 10/15/07, and incorporated herein by reference) may be obtained from the Department of Business and Professional Regulation at 1940 North Monroe St., Tallahassee, FL 32399-0783, and the Call Center by calling (850)487-1395.

61G5-20.001 Salon Requirements.

(1) Prior to opening a salon, the owner shall:

(a) through (c) No change.

(d) Comply with all local building and fire codes. These requirements shall continue in full force and effect for the life of the salon. Submit proof of compliance with all local building and fire codes.

(2) through (6) No change.

Other Rule Reminders:

Rule 61G5-20.002(2), Florida Administrative Code, requires detailed sterilization and disinfection of pedicure equipment. It also requires that pedicure equipment be sanitized after each patron, at the end of the day, and at the end of the week. The salon must also keep a record or log book containing the dates and times of all pedicure cleaning and disinfection procedures. You may refer to the rule text for complete details for pedicure equipment sanitation.

Rule 61G5-20.004, Florida Administrative Code, requires all cosmetology licensees to permanently laminate their license, including a 2" X 2" photograph taken within the previous two years, for posting at their work station. You may refer to the rule text for complete details for license lamination.



Material Data Safety Sheets:

Did you know that whenever you purchase products from a supply store you can request a material data safety sheet (MSDS)? Supply stores are required to provide you with an MSDS if you ask for one. An MSDS will inform you of the ingredients contained in a product and the potential hazards of the product such as MMA.

Continuing Education Tidbits

Continuing education providers should update reference materials and copyright dates when submitting course renewals for consideration.

To receive credit for completing a Board-approved continuing education course, you must complete the course within the two-year period you are renewing. In other words, if you complete 20 hours of Board-approved continuing education, the credit will be assessed against the current two-year licensing period. You are not able to carry forward the four-hour overage for a future renewal.

Also, please ensure that you maintain copies of your course completion certificates for a minimum of three years. You can access your continuing education account information via the Department's Web site at www.MyFloridaLicense.com, or you may contact the Department at 850.487.1395.

Helpful Reminders

- Rule 61G5-20.002(2), Florida Administrative Code, requires detailed sterilization and disinfection of pedicure equipment. Pedicure equipment must be sanitized after each patron, at the end of the day, and at the end of the week. The salon must also keep a record or log book containing the dates and times of all pedicure cleaning and disinfection procedures.
- Rule 61G5-18.0055, Florida Administrative Code, clearly defines the supervised practice exception and when applicants can go to work after completing their education. It is the responsibility of the applicant and the salon owner to ensure that they know the rule and are compliant with its requirements. The State of Florida Partners with Google

The Department of Business and Professional Regulation's Web site provides information to the public about licensees. Consumers turn to the Department for information about professionals, and many look to the Web site for information about results of restaurant inspections. Although the Web site has tremendously useful information for consumers, it has not always been easy for consumers to find the information.

On December 3, 2007, Governor Crist announced an important partnership between the state of Florida and Google. Google has been helping DBPR and several other agencies catalog the information on their Web sites in order to make them more user-friendly.

The partnership between Google and Florida developed as officials from both entities recognized that the public is increasingly turning to search engines to access government services. However, a significant share of information on state agency Web sites could not be found using standard search engines because the information was stored behind a database, hindering citizens from easily finding online state government services. Now, with improved technology, search engines will access and index the records in online databases, making them available to anyone using a search engine.

Under the old system, if a consumer went to Google, Yahoo or MSN to search for a contractor using the name and location, the search results would not include information from the Department's Web site. While that search might return many results from the search engine,

useful information from the Department would not be included even though meaningful information on the contractor exists.

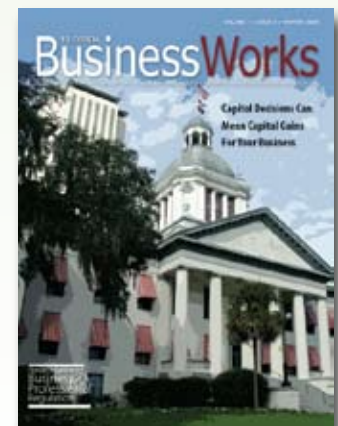
Under the new improved system, DBPR is working with Google to develop sitemaps that will allow search engines to more intelligently mine data from our Web site. Sitemaps are essentially spreadsheets for the Web site that prioritize the information on the DBPR Web site for the search engines. The Department is busy putting hundreds of thousands of records into sitemaps to make the information more useful.

First-time users must follow these steps to activate their personal, secure online accounts with DBPR:

- > From www.MyFloridaLicense.com, select > APPLY FOR/RENEW A LICENSE from the top navigation bar > Then select Path 1 for first-time users
- > You will be prompted to enter the following:
 - License Board/Division: Select the appropriate Board
 - License Profession: Select the appropriate professional license type
 - License Number: As it appears on your license
 - Initial Pin: Last four digits of your SSN and for businesses, the last four digits of the FEID (If this does not work, please call the Customer Contact Center at 850.487.1395.)
 - Select > Continue
- > For security purposes, you will be prompted to enter a new PIN Number:
 - Enter PIN: Enter a new unique PIN number
 - Confirm PIN: Enter your unique PIN number again
 - Select > Continue
- > You will then be prompted to enter a hint question and answer. Most people use questions in which the answer never changes, such as "What is my mother's maiden name?"
 - Enter Hint Question: What is my mother's maiden name?
 - Enter Hint Answer: Smith
 - Confirm Hint Answer: Smith
 - Select > Continue

NOTE: The hint answer is case sensitive. For example, Smith is not the same as smith or SMITH.

At this point, the system will automatically generate a seven-digit User ID Number for you. Please be sure you write down your User ID Number and the four-digit PIN you created. Each time you log on to your account, you will be prompted for your User ID and PIN.

Congratulations, your account has been activated. Select > Continue to view your Account Summary page.

Returning users, if you have forgotten your User ID or PIN, from the log on page select > Forgot Your User ID or Forgot Your PIN. In order to retrieve your User ID, the system will prompt you for license information. In order to retrieve your PIN, you must correctly answer the hint question you created when you activated your account. If you attempted to log on to your account or answer your hint question three times unsuccessfully, the system will lock you out. This is a security feature designed to ensure that unauthorized persons do not have access to your account information. If you get locked out, please call our Customer Contact Center at 850.487.1395. An agent will issue you a one time PIN to enter your account. Once you log on, the system will again prompt you to change your PIN.
