

## Omaha

- Rules specifying how the game is played: Game is dealt from a 52 card deck. The player(s) left of the dealer button must place a forced blind(s). Dealer delivers in clockwise order four cards face down. There is a betting round beginning with the player left of the last forced blind bet who must either call, raise or fold. The dealer will turn over three cards face up in the center of the table and begin another betting round starting with the first active player to the left of the dealer button. The dealer will turn over a fourth card face up and begin another betting round starting with the first active player to the left of the dealer button. After betting is complete for this round, the dealer will turn a fifth and final card face up, followed by a betting round. This is a total of five face up cards in the center which act as community cards. The winning hand is either the last remaining in the pot or the best five card hand according to the standard poker ranking system, using any three of the community cards with any two of the four in the player's hand.
- Procedures for wagering during the conduct of the game: Before the deal, the player left of the button will place a blind bet equal to the minimum bet. A second blind bet to the left of the first blind bet may also be required at the discretion of the card room operator. After the deal, subsequent player in clockwise order from the last blind will call, raise, or fold. If no one raises, the blind may raise since the bet is considered "live".

## Variants

- Omaha High - The two players to the left of the dealer put out blind bets. Every player is dealt four cards, face down. There is a betting round, then the flop. Then a betting round followed by the turn. Then a betting round and river card. A final round of betting occurs. The remaining players show their cards. Players can use any two cards from the hole and any three cards from the board, but it must be exactly 2 from the hole cards and 3 from the board to make the best 5-card hand.
- Omaha High/Low (8 or better) - A split variant of typical Omaha High poker, where the pot is split into two sub-pots: the high pot and the low pot. The high pot is always won by the player with the best five card poker hand. The low pot is won by the player with the lowest five card poker hand. To qualify for a low hand, a player has to have five cards less than or equal to eight. There has to be at least three cards on the board that are an eight or lower for a low hand to be possible, otherwise the entire pot goes to the highest hand. It is important to note two paired cards that are less or equal to eight only count for one low card.
- Five Card Omaha - Same as Omaha but player is dealt five hole cards. Game is played with a maximum of eight players.
