Petition for Variance or Waiver from Rule 61G1-14.001, Florida Administrative Code

David Smith – Petition and Application Review

Mr. Smith was present and provided a brief synopsis of his petition.

The petition was filed on June 7, 2016. Mr. Smith applied for licensure by the National Council of Architectural Registration Boards (NCARB) Endorsement route per Section 481.213(3) (c), Florida Statutes. Mr. Smith did not take and pass the prescribed licensure examination as required by board rule; however, he took and passed the professional practice examination administered in the Province of Quebec, Canada.

Mr. Smith is licensed in Provinces of Quebec and Nova Scotia in Canada, is licensed in Georgia and Alabama in the United States where they determined his credentials, including the examination, as substantially equivalent for licensure, he has practiced as a licensed architect in Canada since 1985 with no disciplinary actions, has met the rigorous review for NCARB certification, holds a Bachelor of Architecture from Carleton University of Ottawa, Canada.

Mr. Smith seeks a permanent variance from the requirement of Rule 61G1-14.001, F.A.C. based on the examination he did pass, together with his extensive experience, his licensure in the United States as well as Canada, and his 2006 NCARB certification through their Certification Guidelines through an Alternative to Examination Requirement.

After reviewing Mr. Smith's credentials the board determined that he met the minimum level of competency and standards which meets the Legislative intent to protect the public's health, safety, and welfare. After board review and discussion the following motion was made.

Motion: Mr. Ehrig moved that the board grant the waiver of the examination requirement outlined in Florida Administrative Code 61G1-14.001, that Mr. Smith has met the intent of the underlying statute, that requiring him to take any further examinations would be a hardship as defined in Section 120.542(2), Florida Statutes, and that the board grant the license to practice in the state of Florida.

Second: Mr. Fernandez seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.
