Petition for Rule Waiver/Variance of Rule 61G1-22.002(1), F.A.C.

Tracee Bomberger

Ms. Bomberger was present. Mr. Spivey read e-mails into the record from Christine Brown and Brian Phipps supporting Ms. Bomberger's request for waiver/variance. Ms. Bomberger provided her professional residential experience background since 1995 including her

accredited Bachelor of Interior Design degree. She stated that Pennsylvania does not require licensure but wanted to gain licensure in Florida. She stated that she took the NCIDQ examination in addition to her experience and education.

Motion: Mr. Johnson moved to deny the request for rule waiver/variance.
Second: Mr. Emo seconded the motion.

Ms. Bomberger commented that another applicant, Ms. Hellstrom, had very similar circumstances to this request and the board approved Ms. Hellstrom's waiver/variance. Ms. Clark read Ms. Hellstrom's granted petition in 2010 and stated that their circumstances were factually similar.

Mr. Johnson requested that Ms. Bomberger contact NCIDQ to locate her previous employer. The motion was withdrawn.

Motion: Ms. Shore moved that the board grant the Petition for Rule Waiver/Variance of Rule 61G1-22.002(1), F.A.C. based on the documents provided.
Second: Mr. Gustafson seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Reinstatement from Null and Void License

Jackson M. Yielding, Jr.

Mr. Yielding was present. Mr. Spivey reported that Mr. Yielding was initially licensed in Florida and the license lapsed null and void February 2003. Mr. Yielding elected to retire from practice in 2001 but has maintained licensure and continuing education in Alabama and Georgia. Mr. Yielding applied for reinstatement of a null and void license based on the criteria that the individual made a good faith effort to comply but failed to comply because of illness or unusual hardship.

Mr. Yielding commented that he had hearing problems in 2001, ailing parents and decided to retire from practice. After reviewing the documents provided the board determined that Mr. Yielding could qualify for licensure by endorsement.

Mr. Yielding requested that his application for reinstatement be withdrawn and he would apply through endorsement.
