New Licensure Provisions

HB 1021 was passed during the 2017 Florida Legislative Session. The bill creates internship programs as an additional method to qualify for licensure as a building code inspector or plans examiner, it eliminates the requirement for provisional building code inspector and plans examiner applicants to be newly hired or promoted, and it allows building code administrators to serve as private providers.
