## **EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S REPORT – Daniel Biggins**

#### PROSECUTING ATTORNEY'S REPORT - Ian Brown

Mr. Brown gave the following report:

For the month of December 2016, the overall license activity case load was 836, down from 909 in November of 2016, and up from 739 in December of 2015.

There were 432 cases currently in Legal to be reviewed, 142 cases awaiting probable cause panel/initial review complete, 7 cases set for probable cause, 45 cases where probable cause had been found/administrative complaints filed, 0 settlement stipulation approved, 9 informal hearings requested, 0 cases awaiting outside action, 39 cases ready for default, 72 formal hearings requested, 4 cases referred to DOAH, 48 cases in settlement negotiations, 0 case pending board date, 35 cases set for board presentation, 3 cases awaiting final orders, 0 cases under appeal and 0 cases had been reopened.

For the month of December 2016, 200 cases were closed, this included 60 Final Orders with Discipline.
