188 **OLD BUSINESS**

189

190 Ms. Chastain advised the board there was a conflict with the February 2, 2007
191 meeting in Miami. She stated that the Super Bowl was in Miami that week-end
192 and advised the board that the meeting would have to be changed.

193

194 After discussion by the board the meeting was changed to February 23, 2007 in
195 Miami.

196

197 Mr. Davis advised the board that he and Ms. Marshall-Beasley attended the
198 September 7-9, 2007 CLARB meeting in San Antonio, Texas. He stated that
199 Buck Chaffee was no longer with the organization. He stated that an Interim
200 Director was in attendance at the meeting.

201

202 Mr. Davis stated that the continuing education process is making progress. He
203 stated the continuing education program had been approved by the State Boards
204 and now it had to be implemented.

205

206 Ms. Marshall-Beasley advised the board that a grading and drainage course
207 would be offered by Kansas State University. She stated that record keeping at
208 CLARB was in the process of being upgraded and several additional changes of
209 the organization were discussed.

210

211 Ms. Marshall-Beasley stated that other States were going through similar
212 challenges as the Florida board.

213

214 Ms. Walter stated that if there was any information on pass rates it could be
215 included on the October 2006 agenda.

216

217 Mr. Davis advised the board that a lot of this information was on the CLARB web
218 site.

219

220 Ms. Chastain stated that she would go to the web site for the information.

221

222 Mr. Castor advised the board that a licensed Landscape Architect contacted him
223 and asked what the requirements were for including your registration number on
224 advertising correspondence etc. and when and where the certificate of
225 authorization number needed to be posted. He stated that he told the licensee to
226 go to the statute and if he needed interpretation to go to the board. Mr. Castor
227 stated that was a frequent question and the board may want to include that
228 information in the next newsletter. Mr. Castor stated that grading and drainage
229 were front burner issues in Tallahassee with the Department of Transportation,

230 Department of Environmental Protection and at the Water Management Districts.
231 He stated that sometimes the ability and the training and the examination of
232 Landscape Architects was questioned. He stated the question was how well are
233 landscape architects trained, tested and how well are landscape architects
234 prepared to do stormwater management, sediment and erosion control plans to
235 apply for environmental resource permits etc. He stated he was asking the board
236 if the exam and the University programs could be audited to determine how well
237 the students were being prepared to do these things.

238
239 Ms. Guillemette stated that statutorily Landscape Architects are able to do
240 stormwater management.

241
242 Ms. Marshall-Beasley stated that California audited their exam and found out that
243 they had duplicate questions from the national exam. She stated that they
244 changed their state exam to include issues pertaining to their state.

245
246 Ms. Chastain advised the board that the Candidate Information Booklet on the
247 web site gives the break down of the exam. She stated that she would print the
248 booklet put it on the next agenda and ask Mr. Ayrish from the Bureau of
249 Education and Testing to attend the meeting.

251 Mr. Castor stated that he helps write the exam questions and the questions have
252 been updated to cover safety or environmental issues.

254 Ms. Chastain advised the board that the next meeting was October 27, 2006 at
255 the Hyatt at the Orlando Airport.

257 **MOTION:** Mr. Graham made a motion to adjourn.
