

## LIMITED SERVICE VETERINARIAN PRACTICE (VL-2603)

**There will be a \$5 unlicensed activity fee waiver implemented this renewal period**

Every day we work to improve the way we do business in order to serve you better. **A copy of your license will be sent to the email address associated with your online account once you renew your license.** This process significantly reduces the amount of time it would have otherwise taken for you to receive your license in the mail. The Department will no longer print and mail initial, renewed or duplicate licenses.

If you wish to print your license at any time in the future you may do so using your secure online account with the Department. Please log into [www.MyFloridaLicense.com](http://www.MyFloridaLicense.com) to access your account and follow the step by step instructions on how to **print your license**. Additionally after you have created an online account and linked your license you may view a copy of your professional license on your mobile device using the DBPR mobile application. You may download the DBPR mobile application from the Apple App Store or Google Play. Once you have installed the application select "My License" and enter the same login and password information that you used to create your online account to view a copy of your professional license.

License renewal information:

**To renew your Limited Service Veterinarian Practice license**, submit your renewal request online with the fee of \$250. If submitted after May 31, 2022, your license will move to null and void status and you will have to reapply.

## Limited Service Veterinary Medical Practice Permits (Clinics)

The clinics that are registered under your Limited Service Veterinary Medical Practice Permit will expire on May 31, 2022. You may now update your clinic locations. Clinics currently scheduled through May 31, 2022 will remain active scheduled date/locations.

- If you wish to continue offering these clinics you must re-register each clinic location and pay a \$25 per location fee.
- Once approved, the registration will be valid until May 31, 2023. There is also the option to download a paper registration form and submit a check payable to the Department of Business and Professional Regulation.
- **This is the only notification you will receive to update your clinic schedule!**

To renew your license(s), please visit DBPR's Online Services to view your account:

- If you have not previously registered for DBPR's online services, select Create My Account.
- If you have already registered for DBPR's online services, login to your online account.

Before you are able to complete the renewal process, you will need to link your license to your account, if you haven't already done so.

## Important information

- There are revisions to Chapters 61G18-15.007, 61G18-15.0071, and 61G18-15.0072, Florida Administrative Code, concerning your Limited Service Veterinary Medical Practice license and clinic location registrations. The full text of these rules can be found at [www.flrules.org](http://www.flrules.org). Please review these rules and comply as instructed.
- State law requires you to maintain a current mailing address (address of record) with the Department of Business and Professional Regulation. All official correspondence from the Department will be sent to this address of record including license renewal notices, important board information, service of process, etc. It is also recommended that you keep your telephone and e-mail address current with the Department. The Department will use the e-mail address for official communication with license holders. Update your personal information through one of the options referenced in this renewal package.
- Effective October 1, 2009, Section 455.227(1)(t), Florida Statutes, requires all professional licensees to self-report to the department, within 30 days of being convicted, or found guilty of, or having plead nolo contendere (no contest) or guilty to a crime in any jurisdiction. A licensee who fails to report this information may be subject to disciplinary action, including fines, suspension or license revocation. To report, complete the criminal self-reporting document and mail it to the department at the address provided on the form.
