**Minutes of  
THE FLORIDA REAL ESTATE COMMISSION  
December 15 and 16, 2009  
General Meeting**

Chair Roger Enzor called the meeting of the Florida Real Estate Commission to order, at approximately 8:40 a.m., in Orlando, Florida, on this 15th day of December, 2009.

The following Commission members were in attendance: Chair Roger Enzor, Vice-Chair Richard DeNapoli, Poul Hornsleth, Ralph McCoig, Michael Guju and John Ruffier. Tom Barnhart, Senior Assistant Attorney General, appeared as counsel for the Commission. Mr. Barnhart declared a quorum present.

American Court Reporting, Inc. (407) 896-1813 provided court reporter services.

**Approval of the Minutes**

Commissioner Hornsleth moved; Commissioner McCoig seconded to approve the Minutes of the October 20 and 21, 2009, General Meeting, as amended. Motion carried unanimously.

**Unlicensed Activity Report**

Director O'Bryant presented the Unlicensed Activity Report and made an oral amendment to the report. Director O'Bryant addressed questions from the Commissioners.

**Proposed Rule Development**

Director O'Bryant reported that he agreed to table rule discussion relating to rules affected by the Department Forms Rules until January to allow the Joint Administrative Procedure Committee (JAPC) to complete its review of the Department Forms Rules which affect Division rules referencing forms. JAPC assured that their review will be complete no later than Christmas.

## **Biennial Rule Review – 61J2 Florida Real Estate Commission**

The purpose of this workshop is to review the F.A.C., Chapter 61J2, for possible changes to ensure compliance with the newly adopted statutory changes. The Commission addressed the following rules:

### **Chapter 1**

1.011 – 1.015 – No changes recommended.

Commissioner McCoig inquired about recognizing the service men and women and their spouses residing outside the State of Florida by allowing them to obtain a license through a streamlined process. The Commission inquired whether this would require a legislative change and whether the Florida Association of Realtors (FAR) would be able to include this proposal in their legislative package. Commissioner McCoig moved to propose a legislative change to adopt language that would allow members of the Armed Forces of the United States, now or hereafter on active duty, or their spouses, currently licensed in another state, to be exempted from pre-license education requirements of Florida with the exception of the Florida laws and rules giving and will have to sit for the Florida laws and rules section of the examination. Commissioner Hornsleth seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously. Director O’Bryant stated the Division will work with FAR on the proposed language.

1.016 – Review of Fees – No change recommended.

2.027 – Applications by Individuals – Recommended changing 12 months to 24 months relating to sections (1)(b)1, (b)2 and (b)3.

Additionally Ms. Rodgers requested to place “quotes” around “The original course completion report is to be given to the student and a copy retained by the school.” in (6)(f).

Ms. Rogers also inquired about the reference to “broker sales associate” on RE10 form, whether the broker associate license is now called a broker sales associate. Director O’Bryant stated he would look into it.

Commissioner Hornsleth moved to proceed with the recommendations for publication of a rule development workshop where noted above. Commissioner DeNapoli seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

### **Rule Workshop Regarding Rule 61J2-24.001**

FREC Counsel Tom Barnhart presented a revised draft of Rule 61J2-24.001, F.A.C. for the Commission's review. The Commission entered into discussion and received comments from the audience. Commissioner Hornsleth moved to accept the modifications as presented by its counsel with one correction to subsection (pp). Seconded by Commissioner Ruffier; the motion carried unanimously.

### **Review and Consideration of the Real Estate Continuing Education Courses**

Director O'Bryant presented the following continuing education courses for the Commission's consideration:

1. Cost Segregation– New Course – Application No. 11823

Commissioner Ruffier moved to deny the continuing education course listed above as it does not comply with Section 475.182, *F.S.* Commissioner McCoig seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

2. Helping Customers Create Sustainable Income – New Course – Application No. 11806

Commissioner Ruffier moved to deny the continuing education course listed above based on lack of substantive information and therefore it may not comply with Section 475.182, *F.S.* Vice-Chair DeNapoli seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.

### **Escrow Disbursement Orders**

Attorney Joseph Solla presented 17 Escrow Disbursement Orders and 1 Order for the Commission's consideration. Mr. Solla stated that "A" was settled. Upon recommendation of the Legal Section, the Commission issued 16 Escrow Disbursement Orders and 1 Order. Commissioner Hornsleth moved to approve the Legal Section recommendation. Commissioner McCoig seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.
