

## **Latest Examination Information for Surveyors and Mappers – April 2009**

Changes to the rules governing the Florida examination for surveying and mapping were first noticed on October 26, 2007. They became effective on October 31, 2008. The old exam included the Florida Jurisdictional Multiple Choice and the Florida Jurisdictional essay portions. As of the effective date of the rule, any person wishing to be licensed as a professional Surveyor & Mapper in Florida must provide proof of a passing score on the new 100-item Florida Jurisdictional Multiple Choice exam as well as the National Council for Examination of Engineers and Surveyors (NCEES) exam (Fundamentals and Principals and Practice). This would include anyone who did not pass part of the old two-part Florida exam.

If you have passed the State of Florida Surveyor and Mapper Exam (multiple choice and essay portions before October 31, 2008) but failed the National Council of Examiners for Engineers and Surveyors (NCEES) national exam, you are not required to take the new Florida Jurisdictional Multiple Choice Exam. At that point, you would need to take and pass both portions (Fundamental and Principles and Practice) of the NCEES exam to be licensed as a professional Surveyor & Mapper in Florida.
